Thank You for Your Financial Assistance

Thank you for your continued support of the ministries of the Orangevale Seventh-day Adventist Church. Our church family continues to grow and thrive thanks to the Godly stewardship that you and others in our church

family are practicing. We commend you for the courage you have shown to trust God in these uncertain financial times.

During the past year you have responded to the needs of our Church Family Budget. It is the fund that is the backbone of our financial stability; the fund by which we are able to support all ministries on our campus. Many think that if they are contributing to Tithe, they are supporting our local church, but this is not the case. One hundred percent of Tithe is forward to the Northern California Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. Tithe funds keep our denomination and the world mission work going forward, but it doesn't cover local costs. The purpose of Church Family Budget is to cover our local expenses and mission. Orangevale, our monthly need is \$17,170 to cover the costs of operating and maintaining our mission and facilities.

One other offering need is the Family Life Center/ Building fund. This fund pays down the mortgage for the facility that houses our school and other church operations for generations to come. Our church family stepped out in faith many years ago and committed to building this facility, just like those ahead of us did when they built the original church facility, the Better Living Center, and Sanctuary that we enjoy today. Our Family Life Center is a three and one half million dollar facility that is serving His mission well. It is almost three fourths paid off, with just one million left on a loan to the Pacific Union of Seventh-day Adventists. Thank you for sharing in giving to meet the monthly principal and interest payments of \$7,000 in 2013, with excess giving allowing us to pay additional principal.

Prayerfully contribute to both of these funds on a regular basis, so that these important missionary building elements continue into 2014 and beyond. God has blessed and ordained each of us to serve in giving. Thank you for sharing in this blessing.

opportunities to find a spiritual leader that can join our family and community.

In June, we met with Pastor Ed Fargusson from the Northern California Conference of Seventh day Adventists. This open meeting allowed the board, and other interested church members who joined us, to outline a vision for a Pastoral candidate. The group shared with Pastor Ed the following attributes, not listed in any particular order:

- Counselor
- Missionary minded

With this information, Pastor Ed took it to the Conference Pastoral Search Committee.

In late summer, it appeared a candidate was scheduled to meet with our church family. This was a false alarm, since the pastoral candidate, from outside of California, determined the move was too great for his family at this time.

Then in December, Pastor Fargusson held another forum at our Church, and informed the assembled group that three names have been approved for consideration by our church. The group then reviewed two

Pastoral candidate's resumes. After consideration, the group voted to ask one to some most with our shursh family. Pastor

to ask one to come meet with our church family, Pastor Jon Cicle.

Paul Kramer invited the entire interested church family to meet with Pastor Jon and Heather Cicle in January. An informal reception was held, then a formal question and answer period. The Cicles spent over three hours with the group assembled. Prior to the meetings, Jon and Heather had a chance to visit the school, the church campus, and the community.

After this meeting, a follow up meeting was announced where the calling of Pastor Cicle would be considered. Everyone was invited to attend this discussion of the potential ministry call, and potential decision.

During the follow up meeting, the group discussed the previous meeting, asked questions of Pastor Fargusson, and reviewed the original vision outlined in June. After a season of prayer, a written vote was held. The decision was unanimous, to ask Pastor Jon and Heather Cicle to join our family.



Where is the 2nd Earth?

Many of my friends hope, after they die, to go to heaven. They often think of a place of peace that will become their everlasting home. But where is heaven? How can we find our way to heaven? Will heaven welcome us after our journey here on earth?

Jesus told his disciples that He was going away to prepare a place for them. Was He going to prepare heaven for them?

Jesus first created our universe and our earth as a place for the creatures. He was going to make. That is described in Genesis 1 and 2 and is called the first earth in which was Eden. Adam and Eve sinned and that changed the first earth. Today we still live on that earth and we will continue to do so until Jesus comes to take us to the second heaven and second earth.

What is the door to heaven? Is it the resurrection? Or is it Jesus? Upon death, do the saints go to the first or second heaven? Or do they go to the second earth? The answers to these questions are all in the Bible. We find them in Isaiah 65, 1st Thessalonians 4 and Revelation 21 and 22.

God created the first heaven as His home and that of the angels. As far as we know, it will continue as such through eternity. I never read in the Bible that the angels will move into New Jerusalem. It appears that the first heaven will remain the home of God and His angels. Jesus will come to be with us in the New Jerusalem, the second heaven. There was war in heaven. Sin in our earth changed both the first heaven and the first earth and rebelling angels were cast into our earth. Some two thousand years ago, Jesus left the first heaven to teach us and save us from eternal death.

John in vision saw a new heaven, for the first heaven, that God called firmament, had passed away with the passing of the fist earth. If there is a first earth, there is also a second earth. The first earth is remade into

the second earth. When the first earth is done away with, the second earth takes the place as the dwelling place of people. There is only one earth at a time, never two. But as recorded in Genesis 1:1 and 8, there are at least two heavens, the place where God and the angels dwell, and our firmament, also called heaven.

The second earth will be very different from the first earth. But it still will be earth. In the second earth we will not just go back to Eden. It is true that Eden was sinless and the second earth is also sinless, but Jesus is not going to turn the clock back. In Eden, Adam and Eve had children, and we are not told in the Bible that



we will have new children in the second earth. In Eden was a tree of good and evil, but we are not told that that tree will be in the second earth. Sin ended the Eden God made at Creation.

The flood came and killed most of mankind, but what emerged was not a second earth, but a cleaned first one.

The prophet Isaiah in Isaiah 65 foresaw life in the second earth. Many things had to pass before the second earth would become a reality. Isaiah does not describe in detail the first heaven or the second heaven. He does not deal with the New Jerusalem, which I call the second heaven. Isaiah in Isaiah 6 describes his vision of part of the first heaven. In vision he sees the temple of God and angels. In the New Testament, Jesus opens up the first heaven to Peter, James and John where they talk to Moses and Elijah.



That same John in Revelation 21 and 22 was given a vision of the second earth and the second heaven. The second earth is remade as a sinless earth where we can live in peace. The second heaven is the New Jerusalem, that great city that Jesus is preparing for us in heaven that will come down to the second earth and be the headquarters of Jesus and the saints. Heaven and earth will meet and the new earth will be heaven for us. By faith, we look forward to the place God is preparing for us.

After Jesus returns, the first heaven (firmament) and first earth will pass away, but the second heaven and the second earth will forever remain as the home of Jesus and the saints. It will be more wonderful than we can ever imagine.

To summarize:

God creates the first heaven as His home and that of the angels. On the second day of Creation, God created the firmament that he also called heaven.

In seven days, God creates the first earth called Eden as man's home.

God creates New Jerusalem, which may be called the second heaven, that will come down to the clouds of the first earth at the return of Jesus.

After 1000 years, the New Jerusalem will come down to the second earth and the saints will live in the New Jerusalem and the second earth for eternity.
